Introduction to traditional leadwork

This course is designed for anyone who has little or no previous experience in designing and making a stained glass panel. By the end of the weekend you will have created a small panel of your own design which will be suitable either for hanging or framing. If you already have a project in mind then let me know in advance as I can then advise on whether it would be achievable over the course of the weekend.

Each course will be limited to five applicants to allow me to provide each student with a high standard of hands-on tuition.

Venue:

Friend's Meeting House, Chapel Row, Bakewell, Derbyshire.

The itinerary given below is designed as a guide to how the course will progress. There has to be flexibility as different people work at different paces, and some projects will take longer than others.

Day One:

9.30am to 12.30pm

The day starts with a presentation on the history of stained glass from its mediaeval origins to the present day. This helps to place the weekend and the practical side of the art in context.

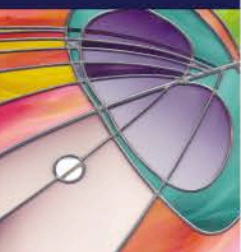
